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
1. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using your telephone equipment, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury, including the following:

2.1 Package Contents

The package contains the following items:

- Base station
- Cordless handset
- AC power adapter
- NiMH rechargeable battery pack
- Telephone line cord
- User's manual

2.2 Location


For maximum coverage and reduce the interference, here are some guidelines you should consider when you place the base unit,

- place it at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.
- place it away from electronic appliances such as televisions, microwave ovens, radios, personal computers, wireless devices or other cordless phones.
- avoid facing radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations.
- avoid plugging it into the same circuit as other major household electrical appliances because of the potential for interference. Try moving the appliance or the base unit to another power outlet.

If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move it to another location for better reception.

Depending on the surrounding conditions as well as spatial and structural factors, the range may be reduced. The range indoors is normally less than outdoors.

2.3 Connect the Corded Base Station

2.4 Install and Charge the Handset Battery



1. Plug the battery connector securely into the socket inside the handset battery compartment. Insert the supplied battery as indicated.



2. Align the cover flat against the battery compartment, and then slide it upwards until it clicks into place.


3. Charge the handset by placing it face forward in the base. You hear a beep when the handset is charging in the charger.

NOTES

- Use only the supplied NiMH rechargeable battery pack.
- If you do not use the handset for a long time, disconnect and remove the battery to prevent possible leakage.





Text and Digit Entry Table 3.5

The following tables show you where each letter and punctuation character can be found. This will be helpful when storing a name in the phonebook or renaming vour handset.

In editing mode, a cursor is displayed to indicate the current text entry position. It is positioned at the right of the last character entered.

Writing Tips:

- 1. Once a character is selected, the cursor will move to the next position after a short pause.
- 2. You can move the cursor within the text by \blacktriangle/∇ to amend the text entry.
- 3. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** on the handset to delete the last character.
- 4. Press and hold **RIGHT SOFTKEY** () on the handset to delete the entire text string.

4. USE YOUR PHONE

4.1 Make an External Call

4.1.1 Preparatory Dialing

Using a handset:

Enter the phone number and press \frown or \blacktriangleleft) to dial the number. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** $\textcircled{\baselinetwise}$ to clear the entry.

4.1.2 Direct Dialing

Using a handset:

Press \frown or \blacktriangleleft) to take the line, and then enter the phone number. Using the base:

Press ◀) to take the line, and then enter the phone number with the pictures.

4.1.3 Call from the Phonebook

Using a handset:

- Press ^{CD} to access the phonebook list and press ▲ ▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 2. Press or) to dial the selected entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

4.1.4 Call from the Call List

Using a handset:

1. Press 2 to access the call list.

OR

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💿 to enter the main menu.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select the desired call list entry.
- 3. Press → or ■) to dial the selected call list entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

4.1.5 Call from one picture

Using the base:

To use a picture big button memory in idle mode, press and hold the picture until the LED turns on, on the base.

If you want to pass the number from the base to the handset, lift the handset off the base to take the call.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press 🌩 to access the redial list.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle/ ∇ to select the desired redial number.
- 3. Press → or ■) to dial the selected redial number. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

4.1.7 Call Timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of each call. The call timer will display a few seconds after the call has ended. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM: SS).

4.2 Answer a Call

Using a handset:

If the handset is not on the charging cradle or the base station:

When the phone rings, press \frown or \blacktriangleleft) to answer a call. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

If the handset is on the charging cradle or the base station and if **AUTO ANSWER** is set to be **ON**: When the phone rings, pick up the handset to answer a call.

4.3 BOOSTER Function

The BOOSTER function allows you to amplify the handset earpiece volume to compensate for the ear's limited sensitivity.

Using a handset:

To turn on the BOOSTER function:

- \sim Press 🎣 at any time during a call. "BOOST ON" displays on the handset screen.
- When the BOOSTER function is activated, press ▲ ▼ to increase or decrease the earpiece volume.

To turn off the BOOSTER function and return the earpiece volume back to normal:

• Press 1 again and the handset top indicator will turn off.

NOTE:

The audio boost feature will be turned off automatically when the call is ended.

4.4 End a Call

Using a handset:

During a call, press *f* to end the call. **OR**

Put the cordless handset on the charging cradle to end the call.

Using the base:

Press () to end the call in speakerphone mode

4.5 Adjust Earpiece and Speakerphone Volume

There are 5 levels (VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 5) to choose from for each of earpiece and speakerphone volume.

Using a handset:

During a call:

Press $\blacktriangle \mathbb{N}$ to select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

Using the Base:

During a call: Press ▲/▼ to increase or decrease the speakerphone volume.

4.6 Mute a Call

With the call muted, you can talk to someone nearby without letting the caller hear you during a call.

Using a handset:

During a call:

Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) to mute the microphone and "MUTED" will be displayed on the handset screen. Your caller cannot hear you. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) again to resume the microphone.

4.7 Set the Handset Silent Mode

In idle mode, press and hold # to turn off the handset ringer. The # will be displayed on the handset screen.

In silent mode, press and hold $\# \mathbb{X}$ to turn on the handset ringer. The \cancel{s} will disappear.

4.8 Set the Handset Keypad Lock

You can turn on/off the keypad lock of a handset to avoid misoperation.

In idle mode, press and hold \bigstar to turn on the keypad lock. The \frown will be displayed on the handset screen.

In keypad lock mode, press and hold \bigstar to turn off the keypad lock. The \fbox will disappear.

4.9 Redial the Last Number

You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called on the cordless handset or on the corded telephone base. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to match with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recently dialed number will be displayed at the top of the redial list.

4.9.1 Redial a Number from the Redial List

Using a handset:

- 1. In idle mode, press \P to access the redial list.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle/∇ to browse the redial list.
- 3. Press \frown or \blacksquare) to dial the selected redial number.

If there is no number in the redial list, the display will show "EMPTY".

4.9.2 Store a Redial Number into the Phonebook

Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.9.1.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To select ADD TO PB.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To enter the name.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to store the redial number into the phonebook.
- 5. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY (b**) to select phonebook melody.
- Press ▲ ▼ to browse the melody list. The respective melody will be played while you are browsing the melody list.
- 7. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to confirm.

4.9.3 Delete a Redial Number

Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.9.1.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select DELETE.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To confirm.

4.9.4 Delete the Entire Redial List

Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.9.1.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select DELETE ALL.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💼 to confirm.
- 4. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY t** or reconfirm.

4.10 Find the Handset

This feature helps you find the misplaced handset(s).

You can locate the handset by operation on the base station as below.

• In idle mode, press *I*/HANDSETLOCATOR.

All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone, and "PAGING" will flash on the screen. You can stop the paging by pressing (4) / (1)

RIGHT SOFTKEY (a) on any handset or HANDSET LOCATOR on the base to stop paging.

NOTE:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

4.11 Make an Internal Call

This feature allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, it will stop ringing and the calling one will return to standby mode.

4.11.1 Intercom

Using a handset:

- 1. In idle mode, press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** and the numbers of the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Enter the desired handset number you want to intercom with.
- 3. The called handset rings. Press or ■) on the called handset to establish the internal call.

Using the Handset

If you receive a call on the base in speaker mode, the call is automatically transferred on the handset if the handset is removed from the base.

NOTE:

If only one cordless handset is registered to the base station, internal call will not be available.

4.11.2 Call All Handsets

Using a handset:

- 1. In idle mode, press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) and the numbers of the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Press 9 to ring to all registered handsets.

4.11.3 Transfer an External Call

Using a handset:

During an external call:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select INTERCOM.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to select the desired handset you want to intercom with.
- 3. The external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- Press \frown or \blacksquare) on the called handset to establish an internal call.
- 6. The external call is transferred to the called handset.

4.11.4 Make a 3-way Conference Call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with the corded base and cordless handset or two cordless handsets. The three parties can share the conversation and no network subscription is required.

Using a handset:

During the external call:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 4 in section 4.11.3.
- 2. Press and hold X on the calling handset to establish the conference call.

NOTE:

Any party (corded base or cordless handset) hangs up during a conference call will leave the other party still in connection with the external call.

5 PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 50 private phonebooks in the cordless handset and the telephone base with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringer tones for your phonebook entries. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

5.1 Add a New Phonebook Entry

Using a handset:

In idle:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to select PHONEBOOK main menu item and then press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to access the phonebook list.
- 2 Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💼 to select ADD.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and enter the name.
- 4 Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and enter the number.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY → and ▼ to select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.
- 6. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💿 to store the phonebook entry.

5.2 Search for a Phonebook Entry

Using a handset:

In idle:

1. Enter the phonebook list.

2. Enter the first character of your desired name of the phonebook entries by multitap.

5.3 View a Phonebook Entry

Using a handset:

In idle:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 to select PHONEBOOK main menu item and then press LEFT SOFTKEY
 b to access the phonebook list.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle/∇ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲ ▼ to select VIEW.

5.4 Edit a Phonebook Entry

Using a handset:

In idle:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to select PHONEBOOK main menu item and then press LEFT SOFTKEY to access the phonebook list.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle/∇ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select EDIT.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and the current contents of the selected phonebook entry displays.
- 5. Edit the name and press LEFT SOFTKEY 💼.
- 6. Edit the number and press LEFT SOFTKEY 📼.
- 7. Press \blacktriangle/∇ to select your desired ringtone.
- 8. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To confirm the setting.

5.5 Delete a Phonebook Entry

Using a handset:

In idle:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to select PHONEBOOK main menu item and then press LEFT SOFTKEY to access the phonebook list.
- 2. Press $\blacktriangle \mathbf{\nabla}$ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲ ▼ to select DELETE.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💿 to confirm.

5.6 Delete the Entire Private Phonebook

Using a handset:

In idle:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to select PHONEBOOK main menu item, and then press LEFT SOFTKEY () to access the phonebook list.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💿 and ▲ ▼ to select DELELE ALL.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY 📼 to confirm.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY To re-confirm.

5.7 Check the Phonebook Usage

You can check how many phonebook entries have been occupied in your phone and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to select PHONEBOOK main menu item and then press LEFT SOFTKEY () to access the phonebook list.
- 2 Press LEFT SOFTKEY () and ▲ ▼ to select PB STATUS. The display shows "XX/50" (XX refer to the number of phonebook entries).
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY To confirm.

5.8 Set the Fast Dial Numbers

After setting the fast dial numbers, you can dial to the pre-set numbers by pressing and holding the respective digit keys from idle mode.

5.8.1 Add or Edit the Fast Dial Number

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to select PHONEBOOK main menu item and then press LEFT SOFTKEY (to access the phonebook list.
- 2 Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select FASTDIAL.
- Press ▲/▼ and LEFT SOFTKEY (■) to select from KEY 2 to KEY 9.

If there is no number stored in the selected key:

- 4 Press \blacktriangle/ ∇ to select an entry from the phonebook list.
- 5 Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💿 to confirm.

Or if there is already a number stored in the selected key:

- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY To select EDIT.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to select an entry from the phonebook list.
- 6. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💿 to confirm.

5.8.2 Delete the Fast Dial Number

6 CALLER DISPLAY (NETWORK DEPENDENT)

This feature is available if you have subscribed the Caller Line Identification service with your network service provider. Your phone can store up to 20 received calls on the cordless handset with date/time information in the call list. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing. If the number

matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed with the number. The phone will ring with the melody associated with that phonebook entry.

If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, "WITHHELD" will be displayed.

If the call is an international call or with unknown number, "OUT OF AREA" will be displayed.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 CALLS" will be displayed.

6.1 View the Call List

All unanswered calls are saved in calls log with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with \bigstar icon.

Using a handset:

1. Press to access the call list.

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY $\textcircled{\baselinetwidth}$ and $\blacktriangle/\baselinetwidth$ to select CALL LIST.

6.2 Store a Call List Number into the Phonebook

- 5. Edit the number if necessary.
- 6. Press LEFT SOFTKEY \bigcirc and \blacktriangle/\forall to select the melody.
- 7. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to** confirm.

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7 DIRECT MEMORY KEYS

Your AMPLIDECT[™]295PHOTO base can also paired as additional handsets with some specific handset/device like our PhotoDECT295 or **SOS PRO 295** 5 which need direct memory numbers programed in the base, and these numbers (4 maxi) have to be added through the regular handset. You can store direct memory numbers (**M1** to **M4**) in the handset. Then, you can dial them directly from idle mode using the pendant or in press one picture of your PhotoDECT295.

7.1 Set Direct Memory Keys in Handset

- I. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💼 and ▲/▼ to select DIRECT MEM.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 ^m and ▲/▼ to select the memory key to edit (M1 to M4).
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and enter a new number or edit the number stored already.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💿 to confirm

8. Picture big button Memories

You have the possibility to store 10 picture memories.

 $\it NOTE:$ To use a picture big button memory in idle mode, press and hold the picture until the LED turns on, on the base.

If you want to pass the number from the base to the handset, lift the handset off the base to take the call.

- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY $\textcircled{\baselinetwidth}$ and \blacktriangle/\forall to select SET TIME.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (n) and enter the time information. The time entered will be in the format you set in section 8.1.1.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💼 to confirm.

NOTE:

If time has been set before, the current time will display, otherwise, "HH--MM" will be displayed.

Set the Date

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select DATE & TIME.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY $\textcircled{\baselinetwidth}$ and $\blacktriangle/\blacksquare$ to select SET DATE.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and enter the date information. The date entered will be in the format you set in section 9.1.1.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (The to confirm.

NOTE:

If date has been set before, the current date will display, otherwise, "DD--MM--YY" will be displayed.

9.2 Alarm Settings

You can use this phone to set an alarm clock. When an alarm is set, the $\widehat{\mathbf{x}}$ displays on the screen. When the alarm time is reached, the $\widehat{\mathbf{x}}$ and "ALARM ON" flash on the screen ringing with the alarm melody for a duration of 45 seconds. You can press any key to disable the alarm. If snooze function is activated, the alarm will sound again at the end of the snooze period of seven minutes.

NOTES:

- a. Key press is still applicable if handset keypad is locked and when the alarm time is reached.
- b. The alarm volume level is the same as the settings of the handset ringer volume. If the handset ringer is set to **OFF**, the alarm still sounds at **VOLUME 1** level.

- If OFF is selected, will be displayed on the handset screen.

9.3.4 Set Alert Tones

A single beep is emitted when you press a key. You can turn on or off the key tone. You can also turn on the alert tones when low battery and out of range are detected. Low battery tone will be emitted while you are talking with the phone to alert you that you need to charge up your battery.

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9.3.8 Choose the Information to be Displayed in Idle

You can choose to display time or handset name in your idle screen.

If you turn on the Auto Answer, you can answer a call by lifting the cordless handset from the charging cradle or base without pressing any key.

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9.4 Base Settings

using the Handset

9.4.1 Set the Ringer Melody

You can set special melody to personalize your base external ringer. A total of 5 melodies are provided for your selection.

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select BS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select BS RINGER.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY \bigcirc and $\checkmark/\bigtriangledown$ to select the desired ringer melody.

9.4.2 SET THE RINGER VOLUME

The default dial mode is best suitable for your country and network operator. It is unlikely that you should need to change this setting unless advised to do so.

- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💼 to confirm.

9.4.6 Change the System PIN Code

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY (■) and ▲/▼ to select CHANGE PIN.
 Press LEFT SOFTKEY (■) and you are requested to enter the 4-digit system PIN.
- 3. Enter the old system PIN.
- 4. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and enter the new system PIN.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and enter the new system PIN again. NOTE:

If the new PIN entered in Step 6 is not matched with the new system PIN entered in Step 5, user is requested to enter the valid system PIN again in Step 5.

6. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to confirm the setting.

9.5. Registration

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Your handset and base station is pre-registered. Up to four handsets can be registered to a single base station.

If for some reason, the handset is not registered to the base station (\P flashes even when the handset is near the base station), register your handset according to the following procedure.

1. SOFTKEY \bigcirc and \checkmark/\checkmark to select REGISTRATION.

- If you have more than one base, press LEFT SOFTKEY
 ■ and ▲/▼ to select the base number from BASE 1, BASE 2, BASE 3 and BASE 4. There will be a ¥ behind the current registered base number.

You can reset your phone to the default settings. After reset, all your personal settings and call list entries will be deleted, but your phonebook list remains unchanged.

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10. ANSWERING MACHINE

Your telephone base includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 15 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone.

10.1 Switching Answering Machine On/Off

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select TAM ON/OFF.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY \bigcirc and \blacktriangle/∇ to select ON or OFF.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💿 to confirm.

10.2 Play Messages on TAM

If you have new messages, the display will show e.g. 02/05 MSGS, which means you have 2 new message out of total 5 messages. New messages are played first, and then are saved as old messages, until they are deleted. Old messages are played again after all new messages are played completely.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () and ▲/▼ to select ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To show MSG PLAYBACK.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () again to start message playback and the screen displays the date of the message received.
- 4. During message playback, press ▲/▼ to adjust the message playback volume respectively.

NOTE:

After new message is played, the new message will be saved as an old message automatically unless it is deleted.

- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () and ▲/▼ to select STOP, FORWARD, PREVIOUS or DELETE to perform the following functions during message playback.
 - **STOP:** Stop the current message playback and return to the ANS. MACHINE menu.
 - FORWARD: Skip to play the next message. The date information of the next message will display if there is next message.
 - **PREVIOUS:** Skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. The date information of the current message will display.
 - DELETE: Delete the current message and the next message will be played.
- 6. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** (to confirm the setting.

NOTE:

Alternatively, you can use the following shortcut keys to control different operation during message playback.

- Press 5 to stop message playback then press Ok soft key to restart the playback of all messages.
- Press 4 to skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. Press 4 twice to skip backward to the previous message.
- Press 6 to skip to play next message.
- Press 2 to delete the current message playback.
- Press ▲/▼ to adjust the playback volume.
- Press ◄) to turn the speakerphone on or off.

10.3 Delete all Messages on TAM

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY $\textcircled{\baselinetwidth}$ and $\blacktriangle/\baselinetwidth$ to select DELETE ALL.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 💼 again to confirm delete all old messages.

NOTE:

You cannot delete new messages, so you will have to play them before trying to delete.

10.4 Record Memos on TAM

You can record your memo message for another user. When you record a memo, the message counter will increase by one and the message can be played in the same way as answering machine messages. Memo recording can still function even when the answering machine is turned off.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY \bigcirc and \blacktriangle/∇ to select ANS. MACHINE.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY \bigcirc and \blacktriangle/\forall to select MEMO.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to start memo recording and "RECORDING" will be displayed.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to stop memo recording and save the memo.
 OR

Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** to stop memo recording without saving and go back to TAM menu.

10.5 Answering Machine Settings

10.5.1 Set the Answer Mode

By default, the answer machine is set in ANS&REC mode which allows callers to leave a message. This mode can be changed to ANSONLY which does not allow callers to leave a message. In that case, your callers will be prompted to call back later.

You can select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY for the answering machine.

Using a handset:

- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and \blacktriangle to select TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select ANSWER MODE.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY to confirm.

10.5.2 Record your Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can record your own OGM for ANS & REC mode or ANSWER ONLY mode. When you record your own OGM, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call. If your personalized OGM is deleted, the pre-set OGM will be restored automatically.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (→) and ▲/▼ to select ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY $\textcircled{\begin{subarray}{c} \blacksquare \end{array}}$ and $\blacktriangle/{\begin{subarray}{c} \blacksquare \end{matrix}}$ to select TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY → and /▼ to select OGM SETTINGS.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY \bigcirc and \blacktriangle/\forall to select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (→) and ▲/▼ to select RECORD MSG.
- 6. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to start recording your personalized OGM and "RECORD'G" will be displayed on the screen.
- 7. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to stop and save your personalized OGM. Your newly saved OGM will play automatically. Alternatively, press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) to return to previous screen without saving the personalized OGM.

10.5.3 Playback the Outgoing Message (OGM)

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select ANS. MACHINE.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY → and A/▼ to select TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY $\textcircled{\mbox{\tiny M}}$ and \blacktriangle/∇ to select OGM SETTINGS.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY $\textcircled{\begin{subarray}{c} \blacksquare \end{array}}$ and $\blacktriangle/\begin{subarray}{c} \blacksquare \end{pmatrix}$ to select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY → and /▼ to select PLAYBACK.
- 6. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to play your personalized OGM (if you have recorded a personalized OGM before) and "PLAYING OGM" will be displayed on the screen.
- 7. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to stop the OGM playback and return to the previous menu.

NOTE:

If a personalized OGM is not recorded before, the pre-set OGM will be played.

10.5.4 Delete a Personalized OGM (SET OGM to DEFAULT)

Using a handset:

- 1. Repeat Steps 1 to 6 in the section of Playback the Outgoing Message (OGM).
- 2. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** to delete your personalized OGM and return to previous menu and the pre-set OGM is restored automatically.
